

Dear Everyone,

By the time you receive this magazine Easter will be over, we shall all have come down from the mountain top, probably even the last of the chocolate wrappers will be in the bin. I hope you all had an inspiring celebration, and that we will all have experienced something of the renewing Spirit of our resurrected Lord. I am writing this during Holy Week and my expectations are high.

Before we leave Easter behind I would like to record grateful thanks to those who have taken part in the renewing of all the embroidery in the Church. We now have a modern and exciting altar frontal with all the associated pieces - burse, veil, lectern fall and bookmarks, as well as the stoles, chasuble and cope to go with it. And, since their dedication on Easter Sunday, two new banners, one representing Churches Together in Amberley and the other for our Mothers' Union. As Mike Tucker details elsewhere in the magazine, we owe a huge debt of gratitude to all our embroiders; but we must also thank Mike Tucker himself, who was inspired to weave the Crown, Cross, and Dove together and thus provided the original design - evoking the Holy Trinity name. Mike also spent many hours designing our two new banners: the Church banner represents the pilgrimage we - Methodists and Anglicans - are on together, set in the local background; the M.U. banner is a modernised version of the three lilies - which was falling apart. So.... Thank you Mike, and the whole team. It was a lovely experience, sitting and working together, sometimes chatting, sometimes in silence.

The old green frontal and the banners are being laid up in the archives. If any of you have any information about who made them, stories about them, etc. please contact me because we would like to put all these memories safely away together, to ponder on in the future.

But what next? To date nothing official has been said but it looks as though the big thing coming towards us will be the Election. I am afraid my expectations for this are not so high, not being a very political animal! The thought of all those party political debates on the radio and television daunt me. So difficult to sift the truth from all those words! Still, we shall have to try and then turn up on Election Day, our minds made up!

In the meantime, there is the Amberley Spring Festival at the end of the month. More information on the following pages and the insert. I hope you all join in and have fun.

Confirmation – 4th June 2005

Have you thought about being confirmed?

The next confirmation service for churches in our Deanery is to be held on Saturday 4th June.

If you would like to be a candidate for being confirmed at this service, please let me know (878515) as soon as possible, and by the **end of March** at the latest. For children, to be a candidate you need to be at least aged 10 by 4th June. If you have not already been baptised I will arrange for this to take place on the day of the confirmation service. (As Amberley Church is run jointly as an Anglican and Methodist partnership, unless you specifically request otherwise you will also be made a member of the Methodist Church at the same time.)

Candidates still at school are required to attend each of ten classes which will be held from 5pm till 6pm on Friday evenings at the Rectory from Friday, 8th April. Four of these classes will be held after you have been confirmed. Candidates from previous years seem to regard these sessions as fun, especially as we try to make them as varied in approach as possible. Each session ends with refreshments so that any choir members can go straight on to choir practice at 6pm. A second requirement of all candidates is that they attend church regularly on Sundays at 10am for the duration of the course.

For adult candidates there will be four classes on the four Mondays immediately prior to the confirmation service from 8.30pm to 9.30pm.

If you haven't yet been confirmed and therefore can't yet receive Holy Communion, please think seriously about joining the course. I look forward very much to hearing from you if you wish to go ahead.

Amberley Gardening Club



We have had two successful meetings so far this year and on February 9 an old friend visited the club. retired professional horticulturalist, **Mr. J. Austen Perkins**. His subject this time was '**Rock Gardens**' and although this particular area of the garden is, perhaps, not quite so popular these days, it was most interesting to listen to such an enthusiastic and knowledgeable gardener on the subject. He spoke on the importance of good drainage and the advantage of using local rocks in any scheme, that conifers were no longer fashionable and that he personally disliked gaudy colours such as yellow alyssum and the straggly helianthemum although he is a fan of campanulas, sedums and saxifages. He then showed some slides of both his own garden and of the Wisley Rock Garden and Alpine House and the meeting ended with a question and answer session.

There was a packed audience on March 9 to welcome Tim Walker – **Director of the Oxford Botanic Gardens** who lectured on '**Colour in a Small Garden**'. Tim has visited Amberley on at least one occasion in the past and his wealth of knowledge and amusing delivery is remembered by some members of the club.

This time he began by showing slides of his wife's Oxford garden which started 12 years ago and showed the progress over this period. He then elaborated on Gertrude Jekyll's theory that colour in the garden was the most important feature and went on to recommend 'haphazardry' (!) and avoid 'garish vulgarity'. The idea is to create a picture and the use of definitive plants such as the large 'Beau Regard' Alliums, Anchusa and the Iris 'Melchior' would assist in this aim. Light changes the effect of plants and he demonstrated this with pictures taken at different times of the day in the same area of garden. He stressed the importance of drawing a plan before a visit to a nursery/garden centre, rather than choosing at random as so many of us do! Both the talk and the slides were excellent and the list of interesting plants too long to mention here. Enough to say that it was an amusing and most informative evening with a great deal of laughter and we are all looking forward to our visit to the Botanic Gardens in Oxford on the 26 April. If anyone would like to join us, please ring Jane Giles on 889395.

Our next meeting is on **Wednesday April 13** in the Parish Room at the usual time of 8 pm when **Tim Miles – Head Gardener at the Cotswold Wildlife Park near Burford – will talk to the Club on 'Spectacular Containers with Staying Power'**.

The March meeting began with Joyce Newton congratulating the Quiz team on coming second in the preliminary round of the Echo Quiz Competition. They now go on to the next round in June.

Joyce gave a report on the County Annual meeting she attended in Cheltenham, and which Princess Anne addressed.

The speaker, Sara Mason, kept us all enthralled as she spoke about the early life of her grandfather, Sir Stafford Cripps. Many of the Cripps family lived in this area, and his father was M.P. for Stroud. Stafford's mother died when he was four years old, and after that he spent his holidays with an Aunt and Uncle, Mr and Mrs Playne, at Longfords. The family home was at Parmoor, Bucks, and many interesting and influential people visiting the house because of the political connections.

Sir Stafford had a brilliant mind, and could have succeeded as a scientist after studying at UCL London, and making several inventions. But he went into law, becoming a very successful barrister and KC. He became a member of the Labour party after the General Strike and was elected MP for Bristol East. He was Solicitor General and later Chancellor of the Exchequer (his maths must have improved after an early school report said he "was terribly inaccurate")

As a regular churchgoer, he tried to let his Christian beliefs guide his actions.

Unfortunately Stafford suffered from ill-health all his life, and this was made worse by his experiences with the Red Cross in France during WW1. He spent some time recovering at Chestnuts in Minchinhampton, but he had to become a vegetarian, as his digestive system could not tolerate meat.

Sara showed some photographs, letters and some craftwork her grandfather had done. We were surprised to hear that he used to knit during cabinet meetings. This and many other interesting stories were told us by his granddaughter, who was thanked by Eileen Smith.

Maureen Stewart had arranged a "Who's Who" competition of famous people, which was won jointly by Honor Widdell, Rhona Kell and Diana Nixon. Tea, served by Mary Meadows, ended an enjoyable afternoon.

The speaker at our next meeting on April 19 will be Brenda Jones, "A flower arranger's garden", and the competition is for a spring posy in an eggcup.




